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# **Vermilion Country School Student Journalist Policy**

(Compliant with Minnesota Statutes § 121A.80 — Student Journalism; Student Expression)

#### 1. Purpose & Scope

This policy establishes the rights and responsibilities of student journalists, defined under Minnesota law, and affirms Vermilion Country School's adherence to state protections for freedom of expression in school-sponsored media.

#### 2. Definitions

- School-sponsored media: Materials prepared, substantially written, published, broadcast, or otherwise disseminated by a student journalist, under the supervision of a student media adviser, and made generally available to students. This includes newspapers, broadcasts, literary magazines, and other formats, excluding classroom-only projects and yearbooks. MN Revisor's OfficeStudent Press Law Center
- Student journalist: Any student in grades 6–12 who gathers, compiles, writes, edits, photographs, records, or otherwise prepares materials for school-sponsored media. MN Revisor's Office
- Student media adviser: A qualified teacher (as defined in state law) designated to supervise student journalists or provide instruction related to media. <u>MN Revisor's</u> <u>Office</u>
- School official: A school principal or other individual with administrative control or supervision of the school. MN Revisor's Office

### 3. Protected Rights

- Student journalists have the right to exercise freedom of speech and freedom of the
  press in school-sponsored media—regardless of school funding, equipment use, or
  whether work is part of a class. MN Revisor's OfficeStudent Press Law Center
- Student journalists retain the sole authority to determine the content of news, opinion, features, and advertising in school-sponsored media. <u>MN Revisor's OfficeStudent Press</u> <u>Law Center</u>

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• No student journalist may be disciplined for exercising these rights. MN Revisor's Office

 No student media adviser may be retaliated against for supporting the exercise of these rights. MN Revisor's Office

### 4. Limits to Expression (Unprotected Content)

Content may be restricted if it includes any of the following:

- 1. Defamatory statements
- 2. Profane, harassing, threatening, or intimidating content
- 3. Unwarranted invasion of privacy
- 4. Violation of federal or state law
- 5. Material and substantial disruption of school activities
- 6. Content inciting or producing imminent lawless action on school premises or violating lawful school rules or policies MN Revisor's OfficeStudent Press Law Center
- Additionally, school-sponsored media may not publish advertisements promoting products or services that minors are legally prohibited from purchasing or using. <u>MN</u> Revisor's Office

#### 5. Prior Restraint & Review

- Prior restraint—censorship before publication—is prohibited, except when content clearly falls into one of the above unprotected categories. <u>MN Revisor's OfficeStudent</u> <u>Press Law Center</u>
- Prior review—requiring school officials to review content before distribution—is
  discouraged, unless there are specific and articulable concerns that the content includes
  unprotected material. <u>Student Press Law Center</u>

#### 6. Publication Responsibility

 Student journalists are responsible for the content they publish under this policy, including any resulting praise, criticism, or potential legal claims. <u>Student Press Law</u> <u>Center</u> **Title:** Student Journalist Policy **Policy Number:** 828.01

• Student media advisers may teach and guide according to professional journalistic standards but may not override student editorial decisions. MN Revisor's Office
